Who We Are ...

Celebrating over 50 years of commitment, Inland Valley Hope Partners serves over 75,000 men, women and children each year through "Our House" family residential shelter; and Rapid Re-Housing; BETA, SOVA, Claremont, San Dimas and South Pomona food pantries; and the Pomona Farmers' Market throughout 13 communities including Chino, Chino Hills, Claremont, Diamond Bar, La Verne, Montclair, Mt. Baldy, Ontario, Pomona, Rancho Cucamonga, San Dimas, Upland,

and Walnut. The shelter houses five families for up to 90 days. The food pantries distribute five days worth of food per person to no and low income families. Clients may come once every 30 days. The Farmers Market operates every Saturday morning and accepts WIC and EBT cards. Begun in 1968 as the Pomona Council of Churches, today the non-profit is a collaboration of faith communities, businesses, community groups, and individuals who care about their neighbors.

It's hard to believe that in America, the wealthiest nation in the world, nearly 25% of adults are food insecure*. When we hear this staggering statistic, we may be tempted to push the problem away and conjure up stereotypical images of bare-footed, unhoused individuals in desperate need of a shower – these are the Americans facing hunger. But this picture is far from accurate. The truth is struggling families and individuals are closer than you think, many live right here in our own neighborhoods.



At Inland Valley Hope Partners, we serve an average of 3,500 children, women and men who are struggling with food insecurity each month. Yes, the individuals we serve at our food pantries do include people experiencing homelessness, but most of the people we assist look just like the elderly man you stand behind in line at the pharmacy or the young cashier who helps you with your purchases. Our food pantry clients include the senior citizen on a fixed income facing high medical expenses, the middle-aged woman with a college degree but no corresponding job, the young single mother whose minimum wage income isn't enough to support her family, and even the college student who has had to make the difficult choice to skip meals to cover his educational costs. Their silent, invisible struggle is easily overlooked by those of us in a position to help because, to our untrained eyes, they don't "look poor", they don't "act poor". But the reality is they need our help – desperately.

Hope Partners' local food pantries exist to help families and individuals access the food they need to live a full and healthy life. But we can't do it alone. Today, we're asking for you to renew your support for our mission to feed the hungry and shelter the homeless. Other Ways to Give

Do you designate your **Ralphs rewards**? Please consider designating them to Inland Valley Hope Partners. That way you can help us feed the hungry by buying your own groceries! New users will need to create an account which requires some basic information, a valid email address, and a rewards card.



Matching gifts is a form of corporate philanthropy which allows companies to match their employees' donations to nonprofits. Farewell (For Now) to Our Friends at Amy's Farm



Like so many in the community, Inland Valley Hope Partners was heartbroken when our friends at Amy's Farm shared the news they would be closing this Summer. The farm's operators and supporters have worked so hard to preserve their land, but sadly, the land has been sold by the owner.

The history of collaboration between Amy's Farm and Inland Valley Hope Partners is long: Amy's Farm regularly sold its chemical-free fruits and vegetables at our weekly Pomona Valley Certified Farmers' Market for many years, and when our friends at the Constantine Family Garden and Orchard closed, farmer Randy Bekendam invited us to continue our urban farming efforts on an unused portion of their land. Since September of 2015, the Hope Partners' Garden at Amy's Farm collaboration has provided our food pantry clients with more than 75,000 lbs of fresh, locally grown produce! That's a monumental achievement in helping the families we serve increase their access to healthy fruits and vegetables and hopefully improve their health outcomes. Farmer Randy also served as a member of the Hope Partners'

Board of Directors from 2015 – 2022 and helped our agency build partnerships with local urban farming projects at Urban Mission and Lopez Elementary School.

The closing of Amy's Farm is a huge loss for the community, but farmer Randy shares that he still has hope for the future, though he admits that he is unsure of what the future will be. We are hopeful he and his crew will be able to keep with their mission to cultivate, educate, and preserve and find land elsewhere in the community so we can once again partner to feed our neighbors who are most in need. Thank you to Randy, Amy, Brad, and the entire family for your friendship and partnership to Hope Partners and those we serve!

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
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
