Celebrating over 50 years of commitment, Inland Valley Hope Partners serves over 75,000 men, women and children each year through "Our House" family residential shelter; and Rapid Re-Housing; BETA, SOVA, Claremont, San Dimas and South Pomona food pantries; and the Pomona Farmers' Market throughout 13 communities including Chino, Chino Hills, Claremont, Diamond Bar, La Verne, Montclair, Mt. Baldy, Ontario, Pomona, Rancho Cucamonga, San Dimas, Upland,

and Walnut. The shelter houses five families for up to 90 days. The food pantries distribute five days worth of food per person to no and low income families. Clients may come once every 30 days. The Farmers Market operates every Saturday morning and accepts WIC and EBT cards. Begun in 1968 as the Pomona Council of Churches, today the non-profit is a collaboration of faith communities, businesses, community groups, and individuals who care about their neighbors.

# **Highlight on Our Rapid Re-Housing Program**

In these trying times, an increasing number of families in our community are facing the harsh realities of housing insecurity and homelessness. As rent prices soar and affordable housing becomes scarce, the stability that a home provides is slipping away from too many of our neighbors.

#### **The Stark Reality**

- **Rising Costs**: The average rent in our region has seen a significant increase over the past few years, placing an enormous burden on low and moderate-income families. Sadly, far too many households are a single paycheck away from experiencing homelessness.
- Limited Availability: Affordable housing units are in short supply, with waiting lists extending for months or even years.

#### Inland Valley Hope Partners: A Beacon of Hope

In response to this escalating crisis, Inland Valley Hope Partners remains steadfast in our commitment to support our community's most vulnerable. Our Rapid Rehousing Program stands out as a critical initiative, providing not just a temporary shelter, but a pathway to long-term stability. We start by offering permanent housing solutions to families with children experiencing literal homelessness in San Bernardino County. Once housing is secured, families are provided with short to medium-term rental assistance (up to 12 months) plus assistance with security deposit and other necessary move-in costs. Then, our program goes beyond housing, offering critical services like financial counseling, case management, good tenant workshops, job assistance, psycho-social counseling, and referrals to many other important resources to ensure families not only find a home but also build a foundation for the future. By working together with local landlords, government agencies, and other nonprofits, we create a network of support that uplifts our participants and addresses the root causes of housing insecurity. Since 2015, Inland Valley Hope Partners has successfully assisted more than 100 families with this vital service; several households have even gone on to become home owners and successful entrepreneurs.
