Who We Are ...

Celebrating over 50 years of commitment, Inland Valley Hope Partners serves over 75,000 men, women and children each year through "Our House" family residential shelter; and Rapid Re-Housing; BETA, SOVA, Claremont, San Dimas and South Pomona food pantries; and the Pomona Farmers' Market throughout 13 communities including Chino, Chino Hills, Claremont, Diamond Bar, La Verne, Montclair, Mt. Baldy, Ontario, Pomona, Rancho Cucamonga, San Dimas, Upland,

Baldy, Ontario, Pomona, Rancho Cucamonga, San Dimas, Upland, and Walnut. The shelter houses five families for up to 90 days. The food pantries distribute five days worth of food per person to no and low income families. Clients may come once every 30 days. The Farmers Market operates every Saturday morning and accepts WIC and EBT cards. Begun in 1968 as the Pomona Council of Churches, today the non-profit is a collaboration of faith communities, businesses, community groups, and individuals who care about their neighbors.

Our House Shelter Client Success Story: A Journey of Resilience and Hope

This month we would like to feature the story of Evelyn*, a mother with a resolve of steel, and her 17-year-old son, who together braved the storms of life and found a beacon of hope in Inland Valley Hope Partners.

Four months ago, with the weight of the world on her shoulders, Evelyn stepped into the Hope Partners housing department. Her eyes, weary from the hardships of life, sparkled with a glimmer of hope as she sought assistance. The



streets had been both her home and battlefield, where she protected her son from the harsh realities they faced. Coming from Alabama, they carried not just their few belongings but a heavy past marred by trauma and the echoes of verbal and mental abuse.

Life on the move, from one temporary shelter to another, took its toll, especially on her son, who battled the invisible scars of PTSD. The challenges were daunting, with Evelyn's son's mental health at the forefront, coupled with the Herculean task of providing and caring for him in the most unstable of environments.

But hope flickered in the darkness when Evelyn and her son found refuge at the *Our House* Family Shelter, a sanctuary that offered more than just a roof. It was here that Evelyn made the pivotal decision to enroll her son in home schooling, ensuring his education continued unimpeded, providing him with the support he needed to heal and grow.

The journey didn't stop there; Evelyn's relentless spirit saw her son enter the Job Corps Program in LA County, a stepping stone towards a brighter future. Despite her own fears and the daunting task of re-entering the workforce after a long hiatus, Evelyn persevered and entered the Los Angeles County GAIN program to rebuild her employment history. Her time at the shelter was transformative, providing her with the resources and tools she needs to boldly pursue a better life for her and her son.

As Evelyn prepares to embark on a new chapter in Long Beach, with a stable home and renewed confidence, her gratitude towards Hope Partners is boundless. The assistance she received was more than just aid; it was a lifeline that pulled her from the depths of despair and set her on the path to reclaiming her life and dignity.

Evelyn's story is a powerful reminder of the resilience of the human spirit and the transformative impact of compassion and support. It is a testament to the mission of Inland Valley Hope Partners, not just to help those in need but to empower them to rise above their circumstances and forge a new beginning. As Evelyn and her son look forward to their new life, Hope Partners continues to stand by them, cheering them on, inspired by their journey and the indomitable spirit of a mother's love.




