Who We Are ...

Celebrating over 50 years of commitment, Inland Valley Hope Partners serves over 75,000 men, women and children each year through "Our House" family residential shelter; and Rapid Re-Housing; BETA, SOVA, Claremont, San Dimas and South Pomona food pantries; and the Pomona Farmers' Market throughout 13 communities including Chino, Chino Hills, Claremont, Diamond Bar, La Verne, Montclair, Mt. Baldy, Ontario, Pomona, Rancho Cucamonga, San Dimas, Upland,

Baldy, Ontario, Pomona, Rancho Cucamonga, San Dimas, Upland, and Walnut. The shelter houses five families for up to 90 days. The food pantries distribute five days worth of food per person to no and low income families. Clients may come once every 30 days. The Farmers Market operates every Saturday morning and accepts WIC and EBT cards. Begun in 1968 as the Pomona Council of Churches, today the non-profit is a collaboration of faith communities, businesses, community groups, and individuals who care about their neighbors.

Blessings

One of the many great perks of working for a non-profit doing great work in the community is getting to hear from successful past program participants!

It was a great day last week when one of our first Rapid Re-Housing clients, Lawrence*, dropped by our offices just to say hi to our staff and share how well he's been doing. We're pleased to say that he and his family are doing phenomenal since being a part of our Housing Program in early 2016. Lawrence has been steadily working as a full-time chef and has even begun teaching



cooking classes. He's recently married, and he and his wife just bought a home of their own! His two children, one of whom was only two weeks old when we first met her, are thriving as well and are excited to have a new home and each have their own bedroom. Lawrence shared that our program was exactly what he needed to get him back on his feet after the long bout of unemployment he experienced five years ago. He said he couldn't say enough good things about our case manager Karen Abram, our Rapid Re-Housing Program, and the difference they both made in his life.

I heard from another past client of the Our House Family Shelter awhile back as well. But this client was actually a child when his family stayed in our shelter in the 1980's! Timothy* said his family struggled a lot when he was growing up, but that he learned that he didn't have to repeat their mistakes. He's actually a pastor of a church in the High Desert area, and he and his wife have six children. They also recently closed on their first home! This new blessing is what sparked him to reach out and say thank you to our agency, and I'm sure others, that really helped him and his family through difficult seasons in their lives. Timothy shared that although he was only about 8 years old when he stayed in the shelter, he remembered our staff was always very kind and helpful. His phone call brought out a few happy tears and was the perfect end to my work week.

I am so proud of the work our staff and volunteers do every day to help our struggling neighbors. Stories like Lawrence's and Timothy's are an inspiration and help keep us all motivated on our more challenging days. Thank you to all our partners for the role you play in making these stories possible!
