Who We Are ...

Celebrating over 45 years of commitment, Inland Valley Hope Partners serves over 80,000 men, women and children each year through "Our House" family residential shelter; BETA, SOVA, Claremont and San Dimas food pantries; and the Pomona Farmers' Market throughout 13 communities including Chino, Chino Hills, Claremont, Diamond Bar, La Verne, Montclair, Mt. Baldy, Ontario, Pomona, Rancho Cucamonga, San Dimas, Upland, and Walnut. The shelter houses eight families for up

to go days. The food pantries distribute five days worth of food per person to no and low income families. Clients may come once every 30 days. The Farmers Market operates every Saturday morning and accepts WIC and EBT cards. Begun in 1968 as the Pomona Council of Churches, today the non-profit is a collaboration of faith communities, businesses, community groups, and individuals who care about their neighbors.

We are blessed once again to share some great news: The Ralph M. Parsons Foundation and the Rose Hills Foundation have granted us funding to hire a full time volunteer coordinator for the next two years. The volunteer coordinator will be overseeing all aspects of the volunteer program at Inland Valley Hope Partners, including the Food Pantries, Our House Shelter, Gleaning Hope Program, Farmers' Market, Constantine Garden, Food Drives and Special Events.



The volunteer coordinator will be a great asset for our programs and our volunteers, enabling Hope Partners to more successfully communicate our appreciation to the hundreds of men and women who volunteer their time and talent to help those we serve. Volunteers are the backbone of our organization, and without them, we simply would not be able to carry out half of our services to those in need in the community. We will also be showing our appreciation for our volunteers by hosting the annual Volunteer Appreciation Luncheon in April. The exact date for this event has yet to be determined, but we will be announcing it very soon.

Our House Shelter Success Story

Reginald & Felicienne – Things seemed pretty bleak for this couple when they arrived at Inland Valley Hope Partners. They had lost their employment, their car and their home when Reginald was diagnosed with stage 4 cancer. For nearly a year, Reginald and Felicienne struggled just to pull together enough money to stay in motels and get Reginald to his regular chemo therapy and radiation treatments. In the midst of their turmoil, they were further burdened with caring for their 2 year old granddaughter unexpectedly. Although Reginald and Felicienne had lost nearly everything, the one thing they never lost was hope.

Reginald and Felicienne were determined to bring solutions to their circumstances and became the perfect candidates to follow the suggestions and referrals given to them. In less than 2 months, the couple has accomplished what once seemed impossible. They attained income when Reginald was approved for SSI and Felicienne, a licensed correctional drug and alcohol counselor, was given a provision allowing her to be his



Home Health Care Provider. They now have a car and were able to obtain affordable housing through a voucher with one of our partner agencies. With the blessing of Bridges to Home, the couple was given all the necessary furnishings to move in to their apartment in late January. Although they are still walking through Reginald's health crisis, they have the stability in their living and financial situations to enable them to focus their energies on getting him well. **WE ARE SO PROUD OF YOU REGINALD AND FELICIENNE**, and we wish you the best.

The Constantine Family Garden and Orchard Reaches Milestone

This month marks the third anniversary of the founding of the Constantine Family Garden and Orchard. Since February 2012, three summer crops and two winter crops have been donated to the four food pantries and the family shelter supported by Inland Valley Hope Partners. None of this would have been possible without the help of many volunteers from local churches, the University of La Verne, the Claremont Colleges, Cal Poly Pomona, and Damien High School, and individual volunteers. In April 2014, we received \$500 worth of garden products from the Kellogg Company. Thank you to all of our friends and supporters!

Our clients appreciate receiving fresh organic produce year round. Summer vegetables include tomatoes, summer squash, cucumbers, melons, and others. Winter vegetables are lettuce, broccoli, cabbage, and cauliflower.

The winter 2015 crop is now being harvested, and we will plant summer crops in April. We look forward to seeing volunteers in the garden for work days on the first Saturday of every month. For more
