

CHAP Becomes a Program of Inland Valley Hope Partners

Inland Valley Hope Partners is pleased to announce that the Claremont Homeless Advocacy Program (aka, CHAP) is officially merging with our agency! With a history of working together and a shared mission to serve the homeless, the union between our two organizations is a natural fit.

CHAP is a grassroots, all-volunteer group that seeks to end homelessness in Claremont by advocating for and supporting homeless adult individuals, primarily men, within the community. The group was born out of the Occupy Claremont movement in which homeless individuals slept on city hall property in fall 2012. Following this movement, Tri-City Mental Health funded an exploratory program to evaluate the homelessness situation in Claremont and found there to be 54 homeless single men and women in the city. Appalled by the situation and willing to help, the founding members of CHAP established the group in July 2013.

During the first year, 40 individuals were willing to talk with CHAP's outreach team Karl Hilgert & Andrew Mohr. Since then, CHAP advocates have assisted 34 individuals in receiving basic survival resources, and each participant has been assigned an advocate or two to work with toward the basic goal of obtaining affordable sustainable housing.

CHAP also offers overnight accommodations at the Claremont Friends Meeting. Guests stay from 8 am-8 pm and receive a hot breakfast and make lunches to go. CHAP cafés have been established at St. Ambrose Church, Claremont United Church of Christ, and on the Harvey Mudd College campus to provide hot meals for CHAP participants and the opportunity for participants to establish productive, sustainable and mutually supportive relationships. The group's most recent development has been the rental of a three bedroom house for CHAP participants who demonstrate potential in moving to the next step toward permanent housing.

Our agencies have been working together since CHAP's inception. While CHAP has dealt primarily with single men experiencing homelessness, our focus has been on homeless families and single women, resulting in many client referrals between our programs. In the past year the desire on the part of both organizations to work even closer together has led to this agreement for CHAP to become a program under the Inland Valley Hope Partners umbrella. We look forward to a great collaborative effort for the future!

Who We Are ...

Celebrating over 45 years of commitment, Inland Valley Hope Partners serves over 80,000 men, women and children each year through "Our House" family residential shelter; BETA, SOVA, Claremont and San Dimas food pantries; and the Pomona Farmers' Market throughout 13 communities including Chino, Chino Hills, Claremont, Diamond Bar, La Verne, Montclair, Mt. Baldy, Ontario, Pomona, Rancho Cucamonga, San Dimas, Upland, and Walnut. The shelter houses eight families for up to 90 days. The food pantries distribute five days worth of food per person to no and low income families. Clients may come once every 30 days. The Farmers Market operates every Saturday morning and accepts WIC and EBT cards. Begun in 1968 as the Pomona Council of Churches, today the non-profit is a collaboration of faith communities, businesses, community groups, and individuals who care about their neighbors.

Wow, can you believe autumn is already here? It seems even our weather isn't ready to fully embrace the new season just yet! For us, at Inland Valley Hope Partners, autumn always means the Walk for the Hungry and preparations for programs to bless the low-income families we serve at our food pantries and in our housing program during the holiday season. We certainly can't do it alone, and would like to highlight a few partnerships that help us make the holidays special for the families we serve:



Albertsons Turkey Bucks Program – Each Holiday Season, Hope Partners collaborates with Albertsons to provide local families in need with a traditional holiday dinner. Last year, 152 families received a holiday dinner through this program. You can also get involved in this effort by volunteering to hand out donation vouchers to customers as they enter select Albertsons locations on Saturdays and Sundays in November and December. Pick a single shift or sign up for several throughout the holiday season!

Thanksgiving Meal Boxes and Feeding – In addition to the Albertsons Turkey Bucks program, Hope Partners annually joins forces with other organizations to provide Thanksgiving meal boxes to families we serve. Last year, due to donations from Assemblymember Chris Holden, Congresswoman Judy Chu, Albertsons, Sempra Utilities, HDL Companies, La Verne Heights Presbyterian Church, Claremont United Methodist Church and many others, another 500+ families received a Thanksgiving dinner. We also collaborate with St. Ambrose Episcopal Church to host a Thanksgiving feeding on Thanksgiving Day at our Beta Center.

Adopt a Family – Nearly one hundred community groups come together each year in support of our Adopt a Family Holiday Program, which pairs families in need with caring individuals and groups desiring to help. For more information, please see the article on page 3.

Our House Christmas Party—Each year, Parera Construction transports the *Our House* residents off-site for a festive Christmas party, complete with a delicious meal and fun party games with gift cards and other great prizes. The employees also adopt our shelter families and provide them with gifts, such as clothing, shoes, toys and household items, each specially selected for each resident.

Mona – a single mother of three young children, Mona came to the *Our House* Temporary Housing Program following her divorce. The transition to financial independence had been difficult for Mona, and, although she had a full time job, she lacked sufficient savings to put a deposit down on an apartment. Out of desperation, she resorted to living in a motel with her three little ones until she heard about Inland Valley Hope Partners.

The *Our House* program allowed Mona the opportunity to put the pieces of her life back together and establish a new beginning for her family. While in the shelter, she managed to save enough money to move her family into permanent housing and is connecting with Bridges to Home for assistance in furnishing her home with the items necessary to make her apartment feel like home for her and her children. We are proud of Mona and the work she has done.

On the morning of Saturday, September 5th, over 30 volunteers from River of Life Church in Diamond Bar volunteered at Inland Valley Hope Partners. The volunteers were split into three groups to help us complete some much needed tasks at our Sova food pantry in Ontario and our administrative office in Pomona. The group at the Sova food pantry worked hard bagging approximately 2,700 lbs. of bulk food. Meanwhile the administrative office volunteer groups created 200 reusable bags made out of used t-shirts as well as put together 100 homeless snack bags and prep 600 newsletters for mailing. The t-shirt bags will be used to distribute food to our clients at the Beta food pantry.

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
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
